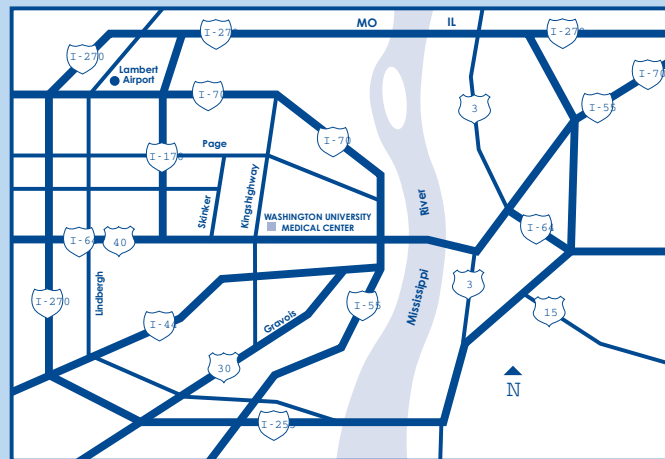

ST. LOUIS AREA MAP



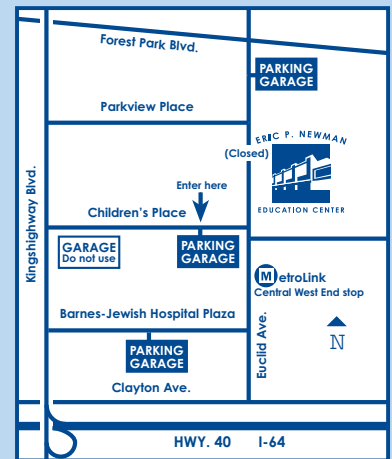

In Memory of Samuel B. Guze, MD

Samuel B. Guze, MD, was a pioneer in the field of alcoholism research. He joined the Washington University School of Medicine faculty in 1951, served as vice chancellor and president of the Medical Center from 1971 to 1989, and headed the Department of Psychiatry from 1975 to 1989 and again from 1993 to 1997. Dr. Guze was highly respected as a researcher, an administrator and a leader in the field of psychiatry.

About the Symposium

Presenters at the symposium are local and national experts on research related to genetics and neuroscience findings on alcoholism. The topics will include:

- The complexity of alcoholism as a disease;
- Effects of alcohol on the developing nervous system;
- Behavioral traits related to alcohol problems;
- Craving alcohol: a major underlying factor for alcohol problems;
- Twin studies on alcoholism;
- Progress in identifying alcoholism susceptibility genes.

A poster session displayed throughout the day will feature the latest findings by Midwest Alcoholism Research Center investigators and other contributors.
