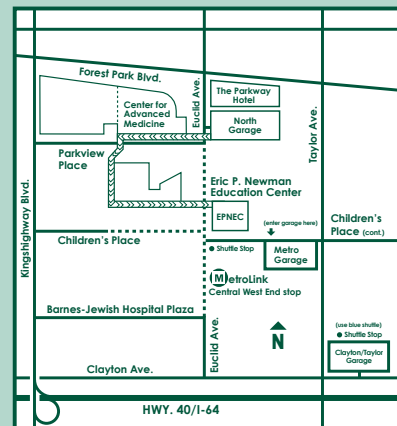
FROM DOWNTOWN, ILLINOIS, AND POINTS EAST

In Memory of Samuel B. Guze, MD

Samuel B. Guze, MD, was a pioneer in the field of alcoholism research. He joined the Washington University School of Medicine faculty in 1951, served as vice chancellor and president of the Medical Center from 1971 to 1989, and headed the Department of Psychiatry from 1975 to 1989 and again from 1993 to 1997. Dr. Guze was highly respected as a researcher, an administrator and a leader in the field of psychiatry.

About the Symposium

Presenters at the symposium will include experts on research related to alcohol use, suicide and suicidality. Topics will include:

- Alcoholism and suicidality
- Suicidality risk factors across the lifespan
- Neurobiology of suicidal behavior
- Intermediate phenotypes of suicidal behavior
- Role of impulsivity and comorbid disorders in suicidality
- Alcohol and suicide data from ER and other settings

Posters are displayed throughout the day and will feature the latest findings by Midwest Alcoholism Research Center investigators and other contributors. In addition, two dedicated staffed poster sessions will be held: one in the morning and one in the afternoon.

Meeting Award Opportunities
